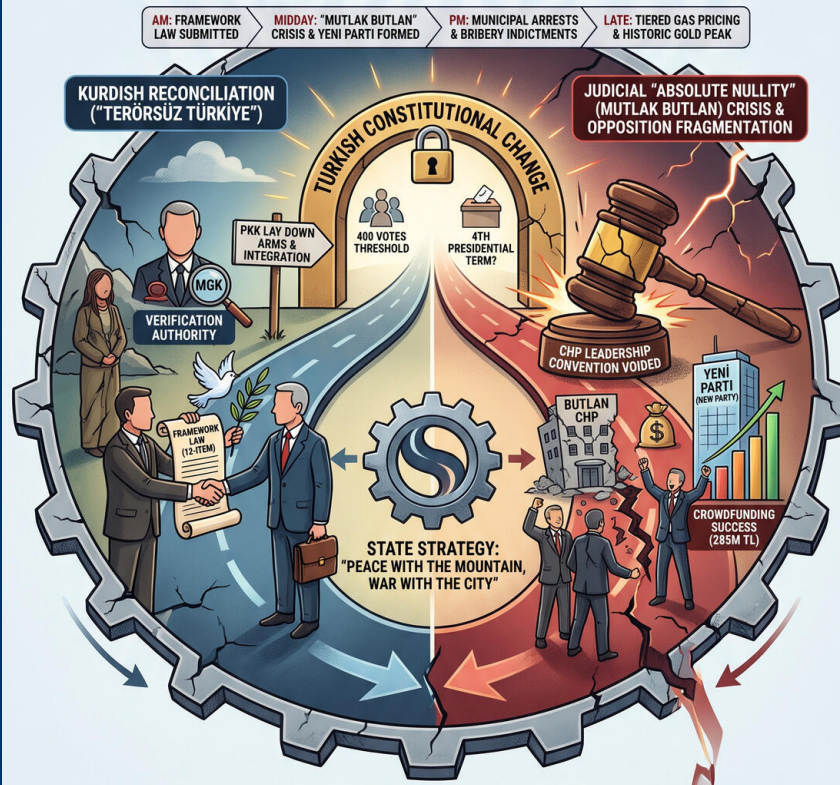

TURKEY'S DUAL-TRACK STRATEGY: RECONCILIATION, JUDICIAL CRISIS, & CONSTITUTIONAL AMBITION

REPORT: TURKEY INITIATES A DUAL-TRACK STRATEGY OF KURDISH RECONCILIATION VIA A NEW "FRAMEWORK LAW" WHILE INTENSIFYING THE JUDICIAL "ABSOLUTE NULLITY" CRISIS TO FRAGMENT THE OPPOSITION AND SECURE A PATH TOWARD CONSTITUTIONAL CHANGE.

DAY-AT-A-GLANCE: CONVERGENCE & DISRUPTION – A TECTONIC POLITICAL SHIFT



MAJOR DEVELOPMENT: THE "FRAMEWORK LAW" FOR RECONCILIATION

- **Goal:** Legal basis for PKK to lay down arms & reintegrate (non-lethal members).
- **Mechanism:** 12-item bill ("Milli Dayanışma...") submitted to Parliament with 360 signatures.
- **Condition:** MGK verifies full organizational dissolution & weapon surrender.

DAY-AT-A-GLANCE

The Turkish political landscape is undergoing a tectonic shift as the ruling coalition, led by President Erdoğan and MHP leader Devlet Bahçeli, moves to formalize the "Terörsüz Türkiye" (Terror-free Turkey) process through a 12-item "Framework Law" [submitted to Parliament](#) with 360 signatures. This legislative push aims to provide a legal basis for the PKK to lay down arms and reintegrate members not involved in killings into civilian life. However, the process is being managed through a security-centric lens, with the National Security Council (MGK) serving as the ultimate [authority for verification](#). Simultaneously, the state is managing a massive internal political disruption following the "Mutlak Butlan" (Absolute Nullity) court

decision that effectively voided the previous CHP leadership convention, forcing Özgür Özel and 91 MPs to form ["Yeni Parti" \(New Party\)](#). This has created a fractured opposition where Kılıçdaroğlu's "Butlan CHP" remains in control of party assets while Özel's Yeni Parti holds the parliamentary mandate.

Convergence is the day's dominant theme: as the government extends a hand to the DEM Party and Abdullah Öcalan to secure the 400-vote threshold needed for constitutional changes, it is using a "judicial scythe" against local municipalities and the new opposition leadership. High-profile arrests of mayors in Üsküdar and Esenyurt, coupled with [new bribery indictments](#) against Özel and Veli Ağbaba, suggest a strategy of "Peace with the Mountain, War with the City." By attempting to solve the 40-year Kurdish conflict through a top-down legislative framework while stripping the secular opposition of its municipal power and legal immunity, the administration is maneuvering to secure a fourth presidential term for Erdoğan through [constitutional amendments](#) or early elections timed to a "victory" over terrorism.

Economically, the country remains in a state of high-inflation "survivor" mode. While global oil prices dip on news of an [Oman-Iran agreement](#) to ease the Hormuz Strait blockade, Turkish pump prices remain stagnant as the government redirects "discounts" toward the Special Consumption Tax (ÖTV) to plug [budget deficits](#). The introduction of tiered natural gas pricing and the erosion of minimum wage purchasing power are fueling a cost-of-living crisis that the administration hopes to mitigate via the "National Solidarity" narrative. Market sentiment is volatile, with gold reaching [historic peaks of 6,500 TL](#) per gram as a hedge against currency instability and the

geopolitical risks inherent in a process that relies on the "word" of a militant organization.

MAJOR DEVELOPMENTS

Introduction of the "Framework Law" for Kurdish Reconciliation

- A 12-item bill titled "Milli Dayanışma ve Toplumsal Bütünleşmenin Güçlendirilmesine Dair Kanun Teklifi" was [submitted to the TBMM](#) with 360 signatures from AKP, MHP, DEM, HÜDAPAR, and Yeniyol.
- The law establishes a 6-month window for PKK members to apply for sentence deferments or discharges, provided the [MGK confirms the organization](#) has fully dissolved and surrendered all weaponry.
- The bill excludes those involved in intentional killing and those sentenced for major crimes [prior to June 2005](#), effectively leaving Abdullah Öcalan outside the immediate scope of the amnesty, though administrative visits are being facilitated.
- Two oversight bodies will be formed: a Presidential Coordination Board under the Vice President and a [Parliamentary Monitoring Commission](#).

The "Mutlak Butlan" Crisis and the Rise of "Yeni Parti"

- Following a court ruling nullifying the CHP convention, 91 MPs have formed ["Yeni Parti" under Özgür Özel](#), while the "Butlan CHP" remains under Kılıçdaroğlu but without treasury aid.
- Yeni Parti has launched a massive crowdfunding campaign, raising over [285 million TL in one week](#) from 131,000 donors to offset the loss of state funding.

- The administration has responded with "legal warfare," issuing [new bribery-related summaries](#) of proceedings (fezleke) against Özel and Veli Ağbaba, which the opposition decries as a "reputation assassination" orchestrated by the palace.

Escalation of Municipal Purges and Trustee Appointments

- The Ministry of Interior continues a "systematic scythe" against opposition municipalities, with mayors of Üsküdar and Esenyurt [facing arrest and replacement](#) by trustees (kayyum).
- In Üsküdar, a chaotic election for Deputy Mayor resulted in a win for the CHP's Sibel Tan Çetinkaya after four rounds of voting marked by [allegations of bribery and threats](#) by AKP officials against council members.
- The "Kent Uzlaşısı" (Urban Consensus) model is being targeted by the judiciary, with mayors being accused of "organic links" to terrorist organizations based on [academic works or past contacts](#).

Strategic Shift in Regional Diplomacy: Hormuz and Syria

- Iran and Oman have reportedly reached a [preliminary agreement](#) to reopen the Hormuz Strait to commercial traffic, with a 60-day trial period of mutual ceasefire between the US and Iran.
- In Syria, the "diplomatic traffic" has accelerated with a historic meeting between Barzani and Assad in Damascus, discussing the [integration of the SDG](#) into the Syrian Army—a move that directly impacts Turkey's regional security calculus and the Framework Law's success.

Macroeconomic Strain and "Tax-Based" Inflation Management

- Natural gas pricing has transitioned to a [tiered system](#), with 9 million households expected to see significant bill increases as winter approaches.
- Minimum wage and pension erosion has reached critical levels; the real value of the minimum wage has [dropped to 19,500 TL](#) due to inflation, while the government signals no mid-year adjustments.
- Luxury spending remains an outlier: Swiss watch imports to Turkey [increased by 7%](#) to 9.6 billion TL, highlighting a widening wealth gap and potential money laundering via "certified goods" in a cash-heavy economy.

KEY GOVERNANCE TOPICS

Armed Conflict & Militarization

- The Turkish military command has been reshuffled via the Supreme Military Council (YAŞ), appointing General Rafet Dalkıran as Air Force Commander and promoting [Özlem Karapınar as the first female general](#) in the Air Force.
- The Ministry of Defense has officially designated "Terörsüz Türkiye" as a [strategic vision](#), signaling that the TSK will support the Framework Law's implementation.

Legal Warfare & Regulatory Risk

- The government is accused of using "judicial design" to eliminate political rivals. The leak of [confidential bribery summaries](#) to the media before they reached Parliament is cited as a breach of the "presumption of innocence" by all major party leaders.

- AKP MPs expressed internal concern during a closed-door meeting about [future prosecution](#) for their roles in the peace process, leading to the inclusion of "Item 10," which grants legal and criminal [immunity to those executing](#) the reconciliation law.

Macroeconomics & Trade

- Turkey's external debt has ballooned to [516-520 billion USD](#), with interest payments for the year projected at 2.7 trillion TL.
- The "informal economy" is being structurally enabled; current regulations still allow [cash payments for real estate](#) transactions, hindering anti-money laundering efforts and tax collection.

Energy & Critical Minerals

- The government is using the "Eşel Mobil" system to absorb global oil price drops. Instead of lowering pump prices, the [savings are captured as tax](#) to offset Treasury losses.
- Tiered natural gas pricing is predicted to hit [35-40% of residential consumers](#), potentially causing social unrest during the peak heating season.

DEEP DIVE: TRENDS AND THEMES

The Strategic Weaponization of "Verification"

The core of the "Framework Law" is not the amnesty itself, but the mechanism of its activation. By making the law's validity contingent on a [verification of dissolution by the MGK](#), the government has created a "permanent lever" over the DEM Party and

Kandil. As analysts point out, the law does not start applying the day it passes Parliament; it starts only after the security bureaucracy [declares the threat over](#). This allows the administration to dangle the prospect of prisoner releases (including Selahattin Demirtaş) in exchange for support on a [new constitution](#) that would allow President Erdoğan to run for a fourth term.

Judicial Cannibalization of the Opposition

The "Absolute Nullity" (Mutlak Butlan) decision against the CHP convention is being leveraged to "organize" the secular opposition into irrelevance. By stripping the Özel faction of state funding and forcing them into a "Yeni Parti" identity, the state is testing the [financial resilience of the opposition](#) through crowdfunding. The simultaneous arrest of mayors under the "Urban Consensus" banner suggests an attempt to break the electoral alliance between secular Turks and the Kurdish voting bloc. The [George Orwell "1984" comparison](#) made during the broadcast highlights a concern that the government is redefining terms like "democracy" and "solidarity" to mean "absolute central control."

The Crisis of the "Retired and Working" Class

A disturbing social trend is emerging where the elderly are forced back into the labor market. Reports of 85-year-olds [seeking manual labor](#) and retirees surviving by [collecting cardboard](#) highlight the failure of the current pension system (currently at 23,552 TL, which is 13,000 TL [below the hunger threshold](#)). This demographic, once a staple of the AKP's base, is showing signs of "learned helplessness" and deep resentment, which the Yeni Parti is attempting to harvest

through symbolic visits and [support for hunger strikes](#) by veterans.

INTERNAL DYNAMICS & DOMESTIC INSTABILITY

Turkey is currently navigating a period of high domestic instability characterized by institutional decay and elite infighting. The "Absolute Nullity" court ruling has effectively created a [split-opposition system](#), with the "Butlan CHP" and "Yeni Parti" competing for the same soul, while the ruling AKP-MHP bloc uses this division to push forward the "Terörsüz Türkiye" framework. The stability of the ruling coalition itself is being questioned as reports emerge that prominent MHP figure [Izzet Ulvi Yöner refused to sign](#) the Framework Law, signaling a potential nationalist backlash against Bahçeli's overtures to Öcalan and Demirtaş.

Public sentiment is increasingly desperate due to the economic environment. The [increase in foreclosure \(icra\) files](#)—with 100 new cases opened every hour—and a total of 25 million active cases suggests a widespread collapse of the "debt cycle" that sustained the middle class. Civil order is also fraying, as evidenced by a surge in "road rage" incidents involving [machete and saw attacks](#) in Istanbul and Adana, which analysts link to the psychological stress of the deepening financial crisis and the perceived lack of judicial fairness.

EXTERNAL DYNAMICS & GLOBAL POSTURE

Turkey is positioning itself as a regional mediator while defensively reacting to the "statelessness" in its neighbors, Syria and Iraq. The framing of the "Framework Law" is

deeply tied to the [developments in the Middle East](#), specifically the risk that the US and Israel might use Kurdish factions in Iran (PJAK) and Syria (SDG) to destabilize the region further. Turkey's goal is to preemptively ["nationalize" its Kurdish issue](#) before it becomes a tool for external powers to redraw borders.

In the international system, Turkey is navigating a fracturing multipolar arena. While attempting to normalize relations with Assad's Syria to facilitate [refugee returns](#) and SDG integration, Turkey is also closely watching the Trump administration's 48-hour [deadline for a Hormuz deal](#). The domestic portrayal of the US is one of a "foe" that seeks to maintain a permanent state of war to control energy flows, contrasting with the "Brotherhood" narrative being pushed within the [AKP-MHP-DEM axis](#). This suggests Turkey is attempting a pivot toward a more autonomous regional "Pax Anatolia," provided it can secure its borders via the dissolution of the PKK.

THE ECONOMIC ENVIRONMENT

Turkey's economic state is defined by a paradoxical coexistence of deep poverty and a thriving informal sector fueled by capital flight and money laundering. The national debt and inflation figures paint a picture of a state using its citizens' [purchasing power to pay down interest](#) to global lenders.

Key Economic Vectors:

- **Currency & Gold:** The Dollar sits at [47.57 TL \(buy\) / 47.79 TL \(sell\)](#). Euro at 55.05 TL. Gram gold has surged to 6,542 TL, with expectations of [reaching 7,000 TL soon](#).

- **Inflation & Labor:** Minimum wage has lost [5,576 TL in value](#) over the last 7 months. Tiered natural gas prices will see the per-cubic-meter rate jump from [16.23 TL to 26.13 TL](#) for higher users.
- **Industry Crisis:** The textile and ready-to-wear sector lost [14,000 jobs in May alone](#), with 400,000 jobs lost in the last 3 years due to high costs and low demand.
- **Luxury Imports:** Despite the crisis, Turkey spent 9.6 billion TL on Swiss watches, an [increase of 7%](#), indicating massive wealth concentration and potential use of luxury goods for "informal" value transfer.
- **Debt & foreclosures:** Foreclosure cases are opening at a rate of [100 per hour](#); interest projected to cost the state 2.7 trillion TL this year.

LEADERSHIP CHANGES

The leadership landscape is being redefined by the Supreme Military Council (YAS) and the fragmentation of the opposition.

- **Rafet Dalkıran:** Appointed as the [new Air Force Commander](#). Strategically, this signals a focus on modernizing air capabilities as Turkey eyes regional power projection.
- **Özlem Karapınar:** Promoted to General, becoming the [first female General](#) in Turkish history, a move designed to soften the military's image during the peace process.
- **Özgür Özel:** Now leading the ["Yeni Parti"](#) after being ousted from the formal CHP structure by the courts. He is currently "Winning" the grassroots fundraising battle but "Losing" the legal battle as summaries of proceedings (fezleke) mount.

- **Burkay Karatepe:** The last fugitive of the July 15th [assassination attempt on Erdoğan](#), captured after 10 years. His arrest provides the government a "closure" narrative to reinforce its anti-FETÖ credentials.
- **Utku Caner Çaykara:** The Avcılar Mayor was released after [14 months of detention](#), though his release is contrasted by the continued detention of others, illustrating the "randomness" or "selectivity" of current judicial proceedings.

EDITORIAL POSTURE & STORY HIERARCHY

Halk TV's hierarchy for the day prioritized the **Framework Law (Çerçeve Yasa)** and the **"Yeni Parti" fundraising success**. The emotional tone was one of "cautious skepticism" regarding the peace process and "alarm" regarding the judicial pressure on opposition mayors. The channel framed the framework law as a "Black Box," noting that it was [hidden from even ruling party MPs](#) until the last minute. The capture of the FETÖ fugitive was given significant airtime, likely as a distracting "nationalist win" story, while the tiered gas price hike was "buried" later in the broadcast to avoid total despair.

Conspicuous Omissions: The network failed to provide a deep analysis of the **DEM Party's internal divisions** regarding the law or the specific **terms of the "Oman-Iran" Hormuz deal**, which could have massive implications for Turkish energy security. There was also no mention of **Russia's reaction** to the Barzani-Assad meeting, which is a critical blind spot given Russia's role in Syria.

GEOPOLITICAL FRAMING

The broadcasts frame the international system as a hostile arena where Turkey must use "state mind" (Devlet Aklı) to survive redrawn maps.

COUNTRIES

- **Iran:** Portrayed as a **resilient and opportunistic** actor. While under US blockade, it successfully negotiated a Hormuz deal that potentially gives it [sovereign control over vessel entry](#), framing it as "competent" in asymmetric diplomacy.
- **USA:** Depicted as **unreliable and chaotic**. Trump's flip-flopping on Iran and the "48-hour deadlines" are framed as signs of a declining superpower that uses [sanctions as a blunt and failing tool](#).
- **Syria:** Framed as **weak but evolving**. The integration of the SDG into the army is seen as a move toward a ["Lebanese model" of governance](#), which Turkey views as a "chaotic" security threat on its border.

LEADERS

- **Donald Trump:** Portrayed as a **theatrical and inept** negotiator. His claims that the US is "out of ammunition" and his [feud with the Defense Secretary](#) are highlighted to show a leader losing control of his own military bureaucracy.
- **Devlet Bahçeli:** Portrayed as the **true architect** of the current era. Quotes like "Every person has won, 86 million have won" [from his speech](#) frame him as the "principled" stabilizer of the state, regardless of his ideological reversals.

- **Özgür Özel:** Portrayed as a **principled victim**. His visit to [starving veterans](#) while facing rüşvet (bribery) charges is used to frame him as a leader of the "ezilenler" (the oppressed) against a "corrupt" palace.

INFORMATION WARFARE ENVIRONMENT

The "Information Warfare" theater is dominated by **"Summary Leaks" (Fezleke Operasyonu)**. The Ankara Prosecutor's Office is accused of [deliberately leaking](#) the details of the bribery investigation against opposition leaders to "yandaş" (pro-government) media before the targets were even informed. This is a clear **Psychological Operation (Psy-Op)** designed to create a "presumption of guilt" and neutralize the "Yeni Parti" momentum.

Conversely, the government is using **"Verification Seeding"** for the Framework Law. By insisting that the MGK must "confirm" the PKK's surrender, they are seeding the narrative that any delay in the peace process is the **fault of Kandil**, not Ankara. The "Mutlak Butlan" narrative itself is an information weapon, used to delegitimize the very existence of the main opposition as a [legal entity](#).

HYPOTHESES AND FUTURE OUTLOOK

- **Opposition Re-alignment:** The Yeni Parti will likely attempt to absorb the "Butlan CHP" via a second convention or a "merger of hearts," but the government will continue to block [access to party treasury aid](#) to bankrupt the new movement.

- **The "Ocalan Speech":** Expect a public statement or video from Abdullah Öcalan [following the Law's passage](#), calling on the PKK to surrender. If Kandil resists, Turkey will likely launch a massive cross-border operation to "assist" the MGK's verification process.
- **Economic Social Unrest:** Tiered gas pricing could be the trigger for "Winter Strikes." If the [gas bill surpasses the rent](#) for middle-class families, we may see spontaneous urban protests similar to the 2013 era.
- **Judicial Purge Completion:** The "Kent Uzlaşısı" mayors of major hubs (Istanbul, Esenyurt) will likely be [fully removed by early 2027](#) to ensure the AKP controls the municipal machinery before a snap presidential election.

STRATEGIC FORESIGHT

- **Short Term (1-4 Weeks):** The Framework Law will [pass the Justice Commission](#) and the General Assembly. We will see the first high-profile releases of non-combatant Kurdish prisoners as a gesture of goodwill to the DEM Party.
- **Medium Term (1-6 Months):** The "MGK Verification Period" will begin. This will be a period of "Strategic Silence" where any [skirmish in Iraq](#) will be used to freeze the law's implementation, keeping the opposition in a state of perpetual uncertainty.
- **Long Term (1-5 Years):** A "New Republic" or ["Second Republic" constitution](#) will be drafted. It will likely remove the 101st Article's term limit and potentially redefine "Turkish Citizenship" to [include "Anatolian" identities](#) to satisfy the DEM Party.

RISK ASSESSMENT

- **Kandil Rejectionism:** The PKK leadership in Iraq may reject the Framework Law as a "trap," leading to an internal schism. **Triggers:** Continued drone strikes or lack of "Umut Hakkı" (Right to Hope) for Öcalan. **Likelihood:** Moderate-High. **Impact:** Catastrophic for the peace process; return to low-intensity war. **Mitigation:** Facilitating [direct communication](#) between Öcalan and the mountain.
- **Economic Cascade Failure:** The foreclosure crisis hits the banking sector. **Triggers:** Default on high-interest corporate loans or a [surge in credit card defaults](#). **Likelihood:** Moderate. **Impact:** Severe; potential run on banks. **Mitigation:** Restructuring of consumer debt and [ending the "tiered" gas pricing](#).
- **Opposition Leader Imprisonment:** The arrest of Özgür Özel. **Triggers:** Formalizing the [bribery fezleke](#) into a detention warrant. **Likelihood:** Moderate. **Impact:** Massive social unrest and delegitimization of the 2028 elections. **Mitigation:** Parliament [refusing to strip immunity](#).
- **Hormuz Deal Collapse:** Trump pulls out of the Oman-Iran deal. **Triggers:** Any ["Third Party" provocation](#) in the Strait. **Likelihood:** High. **Impact:** Oil jumps to \$120/barrel, Turkish inflation [exceeds 100%](#). **Mitigation:** Securing alternative energy routes via Iraq.

- **Trustee Backlash:** Violent protests in municipalities where trustees are appointed. **Triggers:** Removal of the [Üsküdar or Esenyurt Mayors](#). **Likelihood:** Moderate. **Impact:** Urban instability and a "police state" image abroad. **Mitigation:** Allowing the municipal councils to [elect a successor](#) rather than an appointee.

GAPS & BLIND SPOTS

- **The 2005 Boundary:** The transcripts mention the law [excludes pre-2005 crimes](#), but fails to explain *why* this specific date was chosen, other than a vague reference to the TCK update. The fate of thousands of prisoners from the 90s conflict remains unaddressed.
- **SDG Integration:** There is no detail on Turkey's *actual* reaction to the [Damascus-SDG talks](#). Does Turkey support this or see it as the formation of a Kurdish-led army on its border?
- **Money Laundering:** The report on Swiss watch imports [alludes to money laundering](#) through "certified goods" but doesn't provide data on which sectors or individuals are driving this 9.6 billion TL surge.
- **"Yeniyol" Party:** This party signed the law, but the transcripts [do not define its origin](#) or ideology, leaving its role in the "New Coalition" unclear.
