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GLOBAL POWER SHIFT: BRICS CONSOLIDATION AND STRATEGIC ENERGY BLOCKADES CHALLENGE WESTERN HEGEMONY

DAY-AT-A-GLANCE

September 15, 2026, marked a decisive pivot in the global geopolitical arena, characterized by the institutionalization of a multipolar order through the BRICS New Delhi Summit and a simultaneous, coordinated squeeze on Western energy and industrial supply chains. While the BRICS nations, led by Russia, China, and India, formalized a 140-point declaration aimed at dismantling the unilateral sanctions regime and establishing autonomous financial systems, the West faced a burgeoning "Great Fuel Crisis." Strategic maritime chokepoints—specifically the Bab-el-Mandeb and Hormuz straits—remained under de facto blockade by Houthi forces, driving global oil prices toward \$110 per barrel and threatening the total collapse of European heavy industry, which is already reeling from the loss of Ukrainian metallurgical raw materials.

Militarily, the Russian Ministry of Defense reported significant tactical successes,

claiming the closure of the "Kharkiv kettle" and the liberation of key settlements like Alkhavotka, while advancing toward the strategic hub of Orekhov in Zaporozhye. In contrast, the Western response appears increasingly desperate and fragmented. The U.S. has escalated tensions in the Arctic by deploying MK-70 missile launchers to Norway—a move framed by Moscow as a direct threat to the Northern Sea Route—while internal political decay in Kyiv reached a fever pitch with the flight and dismissal of Prosecutor General Ruslan Kravchenko amidst a public war between competing anti-corruption agencies. In the U.S., the Republican party appears to be transitioning into a "post-Trump" era, with JD Vance emerging as a preferred interlocutor for major donors, even as Donald Trump continues to make populist promises of "helicopter money" to secure an increasingly unstable domestic electorate.

MAJOR DEVELOPMENTS

- **BRICS New Delhi Summit Consolidation:** The bloc finalized the "New Delhi Declaration," a comprehensive roadmap for a multipolar financial architecture, including the [BRICS Pay system](#) designed to bypass the SWIFT network and facilitate trade in national currencies.
- **Houthi Maritime and Energy Blockade:** Yemeni Houthi forces successfully targeted Saudi Arabian [oil pipelines and airports](#), effectively closing the Bab-el-Mandeb and Hormuz straits to Western-aligned shipping, driving oil prices above \$100/barrel.

- **Kharkiv Tactical Breakthrough:** Russian forces have reportedly encircled a large Ukrainian contingent in the [Kharkiv kettle](#), capturing the settlement of Alkhavatka and cutting off critical logistics lines to the rear.
- **Kyiv Institutional Collapse:** The dismissal of Prosecutor General Ruslan Kravchenko, who [fled to France](#) before his firing, has exposed a deep-seated war for power between Zelensky's administration and the U.S.-backed National Anti-Corruption Bureau (NABU).
- **Arctic Militarization:** The U.S. deployment of MK-70 vertical launch systems to Norway places [Russian polar interests](#) under direct threat, with analysts suggesting this is a precursor to blocking the Northern Sea Route.
- **European Industrial Decay:** The systematic destruction of Ukrainian metallurgical plants like Azovstal and Zaporozhstal has deprived Europe of essential raw materials for [green metallurgy](#), forcing a reliance on more expensive and carbon-intensive imports from Australia and Brazil.

KEY GOVERNANCE TOPICS

Armed Conflict & Militarization The conflict in Ukraine has transitioned into a phase of rapid industrial attrition and encirclement. Russian "North" and "East" groupings are leveraging [mobile drone units](#) and heavy flame-thrower systems like the "Tosochka" to dismantle Ukrainian fortifications in the Donbas and Zaporozhye. Simultaneously, the Northern Flank is heating up as NATO increases its permanent [British commando presence](#) in Norway, shifting from seasonal exercises to year-round Arctic combat readiness.

Energy & Critical Minerals A global fuel crisis is being weaponized. The Houthi blockade of the Bab-el-Mandeb strait has removed approximately [2.5 million barrels](#) of oil from the daily global market. European nations, particularly Germany, face industrial insolvency as the cost of energy and raw steel imports skyrockets. The Kremlin noted that only the [lifting of sanctions](#) on Russian energy could stabilize these spiraling prices.

Diplomacy & Statecraft The BRICS summit has moved beyond rhetoric into functional statecraft. The [New Bank of Development](#) is being positioned as a direct alternative to the IMF, providing "sovereign models" of growth for the Global South. Diplomatic maneuvers between China and India, including the first [leadership visit in six years](#), signal a reduction in regional friction to present a united front against U.S. dollar hegemony.

Tech Sovereignty & AI Technological competition has reached a "cyber-warfare" threshold. The U.S. NSA is undergoing its largest [internal reorganization](#) in a decade to focus on China and AI-driven threats. Meanwhile, warnings from Anthropic CEO Dario Amadei suggest that AI could [control the internet](#) within a year, leading to calls for urgent international regulation to prevent technology from escaping human oversight.

DEEP DIVE: TRENDS AND THEMES

The Weaponization of Geography A recurring theme is the strategic use of maritime chokepoints to exert geopolitical leverage. The Houthis have successfully demonstrated that asymmetric forces can paralyze global trade by controlling the [Bab-el-Mandeb strait](#), termed the "Gate of Tears." This geography-centric warfare extends to the

Arctic, where the U.S. is attempting to turn the Norwegian coast into a [bastion against Russia's](#) Northern Sea Route, a trade artery that South Korea and other Asian economies are increasingly eager to utilize to bypass Middle Eastern instability.

The Collapse of the "Proxy" Governance Model Kyiv's internal fractures suggest the limits of managed governance. The public warfare between the Prosecutor General's office and U.S.-backed NABU represents a [loss of central control](#) by President Zelensky. Analysts characterize Zelensky as becoming a "British Queen" figure—ceremonial but increasingly powerless as his siloviki (security officials) engage in cannibalistic infighting over [diminishing Western aid](#).

De-Dollarization as a Security Strategy BRICS nations are no longer just discussing de-dollarization; they are building the infrastructure for it. The use of [rubles, yuan, and dirhams](#) in international settlements is framed as a defense mechanism against "illegal" unilateral sanctions. The goal is a "seamless economic reality" where the West no longer has the power to disconnect sovereign states from the global market.

INTERNAL DYNAMICS & DOMESTIC INSTABILITY

- **Ukraine:** The nation is facing an institutional meltdown. The [resignation of the Prosecutor General](#) while abroad and allegations of embezzlement involving "scam call centers" suggest the government is losing its mandate. Economic indicators are dire, with GDP losses estimated at 1.5% due to [infrastructure damage](#) and export losses reaching \$40 billion.

- **United States:** Domestic stability is threatened by hyper-polarization and economic populism. Trump's promise to distribute [1.3 trillion dollars](#)—roughly 20% of the budget—is viewed as a desperate attempt to maintain relevance as JD Vance begins to court the [GOP's donor class](#).
- **European Union:** Labor unrest is growing, particularly in France, where [fishermen and entrepreneurs](#) are protesting fuel prices. The "Great Fuel Crisis" is eroding the social contract, as citizens choose between heating and food.
- **Latvia/Lithuania:** The Baltic states are shifting toward extreme internal security measures. Latvia has [banned Russian books](#) and newspapers, while Lithuania is considering constitutional changes to host [nuclear weapons](#), indicating a total mobilization of their societies for a potential direct conflict with Russia.

EXTERNAL DYNAMICS & GLOBAL POSTURE

The global posture of the Russian-led coalition is one of proactive multipolarity. Russia is framing the "outside world" not as a Western-dominated system, but as a fracturing arena where the Global Majority is reclaiming sovereignty. This is evidenced by the [China-Russia lunar station](#) initiative and the expansion of BRICS to include key energy players like Iran and the UAE. Russia is projecting power not just through military force, but by [securing the Arctic](#) as a global logistics alternative.

Conversely, the West is portrayed as a reactive, chaotic bloc. The U.S. posture on the Middle East is seen as ineffective, with Washington unable to protect Saudi [oil infrastructure](#) from Houthi strikes. The U.S.

strategy appears to be retreating into a "fortress Norway" posture in the North, while weaponizing "legal warfare" and sanctions that are increasingly backfiring on European industrial centers.

THE ECONOMIC ENVIRONMENT

The global economic climate is defined by extreme commodity volatility and a massive realignment of industrial supply chains. The destruction of Ukrainian metallurgical capacity has caused a [40% increase](#) in the cost of raw materials for European steel producers. In the energy sector, oil has hit [110 dollars per barrel](#), a direct result of the Houthi maritime blockade.

- **Energy Prices:** Oil at \$110/barrel; U.S. strategic reserves at [lowest level since 1982](#).
- **Metallurgy:** Loss of 5 million tons of Ukrainian steel exports; European reliance on Australian/Brazilian ore increasing costs by [20-40%](#).
- **Financial Systems:** BRICS Pay launched to facilitate settlements in [national currencies](#), specifically yuan and dirhams.
- **Currency:** Deepening de-dollarization as Saudi Arabia explores "nuclear-level" financial cooperation with [Pakistan](#) to bypass Western umbrellas.
- **Ukraine Budget:** War costs estimated at [190 million dollars per day](#); corruption losses in procurement estimated at \$1.2 billion annually.

LEADERSHIP CHANGES

The day's events highlight a purging of U.S.-aligned figures in Kyiv and the rise of

nationalist-populist figures in the U.S. and Baltics.

- **Ruslan Kravchenko:** The Ukrainian Prosecutor General was [fired by the Rada](#) after fleeing to France; his dismissal signals a victory for factions seeking to limit NABU's influence.
- **Semyon Krivonos:** The head of NABU is under immense pressure following [corruption allegations](#) involving land deals from 2014, signaling a U.S. loss of leverage over Ukrainian law enforcement.
- **JD Vance:** Framed as the [rising star](#) of the GOP, actively being courted by major tech and energy sponsors as the future of the America First movement.
- **Lesya Karnaukh:** Dismissed as acting head of the [Ukraine Tax Service](#), continuing the purge of Kravchenko-aligned bureaucrats.

EDITORIAL POSTURE & STORY HIERARCHY

The Zvezda network maintains a triumphalist and nationalistic editorial posture. The lead stories focused on Russian military precision, specifically the [mobile anti-drone groups](#) and the liberation of settlements in Kharkiv. These are presented with high production value, emphasizing Russian technological and moral superiority. The secondary tier of stories focused on Western failure—the fuel crisis, Houthi dominance in the Red Sea, and the institutional rot in Kyiv. BRICS was framed as the "future," while NATO was framed as a decaying relic of the 20th century. Conspicuously omitted were any details on Russian casualty rates or the logistical challenges of maintaining the offensive in multiple directions simultaneously.

GEOPOLITICAL FRAMING

The world is divided into a "Global Majority" seeking stability and a "Western Hegemon" sowing chaos to maintain power.

COUNTRIES

- **Russia:** Portrayed as a stable, technologically advanced **liberator**. "Our units are [closing the bag](#) on the enemy."
- **Ukraine:** A chaotic, **corrupt vessel** of Western interests. "Billions of dollars simply [dissolved in the system](#)."
- **USA:** A **declining hegemon** resorting to economic populism and Arctic provocation. "Trump is promising [helicopter money](#) he doesn't have."
- **Norway:** A **hostile platform** for U.S. missiles. "MK-70 launchers represent a [direct threat](#) to our polar interests."
- **Saudi Arabia:** A **weakened actor** vulnerable to Houthi pressure. "Their army is merely [parade-ground window dressing](#)."

LEADERS

- **Vladimir Putin:** A **principled strategist** building a multipolar world. "Russia stands for [equal and unlimited opportunities](#)."
- **Volodymyr Zelensky:** A **weak and inept** leader losing control. "He has effectively become a [British Queen](#)."
- **Donald Trump:** A **desperate populist** making impossible promises. "His rhetoric is no longer [taken seriously](#)."
- **JD Vance:** A **competent successor** to the MAGA movement. "The donor class is already [betting on him](#)."

INFORMATION WARFARE ENVIRONMENT

- **Narrative Seeding:** The broadcast is actively seeding the idea that Western "green" policies are a facade for industrial insolvency, linking the [destruction of Ukrainian steel plants](#) directly to the collapse of the German auto industry.
- **Censorship & Repression:** Latvian authorities are accused of **ethnic cleansing** of the mind by [banning Russian literature](#), framed as a return to Nazi-era practices.
- **Psy-Ops:** The deployment of the "Houthi threat" is used to demonstrate U.S. military impotence. The claim that [20 U.S. bases](#) have been destroyed by Iran is a significant escalation of rhetoric, aimed at demoralizing Western audiences.

HYPOTHESES AND FUTURE OUTLOOK

- **Arctic Flashpoint:** The deployment of MK-70 systems in Norway will likely lead to a reciprocal Russian deployment of hypersonic Zircon missiles in the Barents Sea, turning the Arctic into a [permanent high-tension zone](#).
- **Kyiv Coup Potential:** As Zelensky loses control of the siloviki, a military-led ["palace coup"](#) or an internal "Maidan 3.0" becomes increasingly probable, potentially involving General Budanov or factions aligned against NABU.
- **Global Oil Price Spike:** If the Houthi blockade persists through the winter, oil will likely exceed [130 dollars](#), leading to widespread social unrest and potential government collapses in Europe.

STRATEGIC FORESIGHT

Short Term (1-4 Weeks): Expect a total Russian takeover of the Kharkiv kettle and a new offensive toward [Slavyansk and Kramatorsk](#). In the U.S., the fallout from the Kravchenko firing may lead to a pause in congressional aid for Ukraine as audit demands intensify.

Medium Term (1-6 Months): The BRICS Pay system will likely undergo its first large-scale pilot in [oil and grain trades](#). Europe will face a critical shortage of steel for its construction and automotive sectors, leading to massive layoffs in Germany and France.

Long Term (1-5 Years): A permanent shift in global logistics toward the [Northern Sea Route](#), with Russia and China providing the primary security and icebreaking infrastructure. The U.S. dollar's role as the primary reserve currency will likely be reduced to regional rather than global dominance.

RISK ASSESSMENT
